

From I-95, take exit 4 (Indian Field Rd.). Coming from New York (northbound side), turn left off ramp. Coming from New Haven (southbound side), turn right. Follow Indian Field Road to the traffic light at Route 1 (also called Post Rd. or East Putnam Ave.). Turn left and continue for about 1.5 miles (3 traffic lights) until you see large parking lot and Christ Church on your left.

Mackenzie's Grill Room, 148 Sound Beach Ave., Old Greenwich, CT 06870

From I-95 (North or South): Take exit 5, theUS-1 N exit, toward Stamford/Old Greenwich. Turn right onto E. Putnam Ave./US-1. CVS Pharmacy in Riverside Commons is on the corner. Take the 1st right onto Sound Beach Ave. (just past the Getty Mart on the corner). If you reach Boulder Ave. you've gone about 0.1 mile too far. Mackenzie's is on the left just before the train tracks.

Oak Hills Restaurant, Oak Hills Park Golf Course, 165 Fillow St., Norwalk, CT

Directions: I-95 Exit 13 from either direction RIGHT onto Rt. 1 (Connecticut Ave). Continue north thru a couple of traffic signals. LEFT onto Richards Ave. (Shell station on corner). Continue to end. RIGHT onto Fillow Street. Go 300 yards; bear RIGHT. ***After you pass tennis courts on the right, go 1/4 mile & RIGHT into Oak Hills Park (Charles Marshall Drive). Follow to "Oak Hills Restaurant on the green" and turn LEFT into parking lot in the rear of restaurant. MERRITT PARKWAY: Exit 38 from either direction, RIGHT onto Rt. 123 (New Canaan Ave) – At first traffic signal, TURN onto Nursery Street. At stop sign, LEFT onto Ponus Ave. RIGHT at fork in road onto Fox Run Road. Go thru one traffic signal, take next LEFT onto Fillow St. Follow from *** above.
