DIRECTIONS TO COTTON CLUB GREENWICH EVENTS

Tomes-Higgins House (located at Christ Church Greenwich)

From I-95, take exit 4 (Indian Field Road). Coming from New York (the northbound side), turn left off the ramp. Coming from New Haven (the southbound side), turn right. Follow Indian Field Road to the traffic light at Route 1 (also called Post Road or East Putnam Ave.). Turn left and continue for about 1.5 miles (3 traffic lights) until you pass Christ Church on your left.

Arena at Harbor Yard, 500 Main Street, Bridgeport, CT

I-95 northbound: Use Exit 27, Lafayette Blvd./ Downtown (not 27A!). Continue straight through the light for 3 blocks. The parking lot is on the right.

Rip Van Winkle Lanes, Norwalk, CT

From I-95 north, take Exit 13. Turn right onto Connecticut Ave. Lanes are just a few hundred yards up on your right. From I-95 south, take Exit 14. Make a left onto Connecticut Ave. Lanes are about 1/2 to 3/4 of a mile on left.

Zody's 19th Hole, E. Gaynor Brennan Golf Course, Stamford, CT

From I-95 north: Take exit 6/Harvard Ave. At end of ramp, go straight one block. Turn left at next light onto West Ave., go straight across Post Road, then bear left around the island, turning onto Stillwater Ave. Continue on Stillwater about 1/8 mi. On your right you will see the Hubbard Heights golf course. Turn into the parking lot. From I-95 south: turn right off of exit 6 onto West Ave., then follow the directions above.

Mackenzie's Grill Room, Old Greenwich, CT

From I-95 (North or South): Take exit 5, the US-1 N exit, toward Stamford/Old Greenwich. Turn right onto E. Putnam Ave./US-1. CVS Pharmacy in Riverside Commons is on the corner. Take the 1st right onto Sound Beach Ave. (just past the Getty Mart on the corner). If you reach Boulder Ave. you've gone about 0.1 mile too far.
