The meeting on April 10 will focus on "Rules of Civility," the "hot" book of summer 2011 and a debut novel by Amor Towles. Set in New York City in 1938, the story is of a life-changing year in the life of Katey Kontent, age 25, as she embarks on a journey from a Wall Street secretarial pool through the upper strata of New York society. Her quest takes her from a Greenwich Village jazz bar through the mansions of the Upper East Side and along the way shows how spur of the moment decisions can define life for decades. Unlike most book club selections, this novel is not in yet in paperback; however libraries. especially Darien, have many copies in circulation.

For May 8 the book under discussion will be "Unbroken — a WWII Story of Survival, Redemption," Resilience and bν Laura Hillenbrand, author of "Seabiscuit." In May 1943 an Army Air Force bomber crashes into the Pacific Ocean and disappears, leaving only debris floating on the water. One man survives, Lt. Louis Zamperini. A delinquent in his teens and a runner in the Berlin Olympics, Zamperini's survival is a dramatic story of human endurance.



Directions to Christ Church Greenwich: From I-95 take exit 4 (Indian Field Rd.). Turn left off the ramp if you were heading northbound (from NY), or turn right if you were heading southbound (from New Haven). Follow Indian Field Rd. to Route 1 (Post Rd. or East Putnam Ave.). Turn left at the traffic light and continue for about 1.5 miles (3 traffic lights) to Christ Church on your left. We meet in the Tomes-Higgins House, 216 E. Putnam Ave., Greenwich 06830 (which is the white Victorian building to the right of the church as you face it) every Wednesday at 7:30 pm except for occasional holidays. FROM THE CONNECTICUT THRUWAY I – 95: Take Exit #4 (Indian Field Road) Turn LEFT if coming from New York, and RIGHT if coming from Stamford, onto Indian Field Road. Drive 6/10ths of a mile North on Indian Field Road to a Stop Light at the intersection of East Putnam Avenue. Turn left onto East Putnam Avenue. Drive 2/10ths of a mile West to the first Stop Light located at the intersection of Hillside Road. Drive North 1/10th of a mile. The Greenwich High School is on your left, and the parking lot is behind the School.

FROM THE MERRITT PARKWAY Rt.#15: Take Exit #31 (North Street). Turn onto North Street heading SOUTH. Drive South 3 miles to the intersection of Fairfield Avenue. Turn LEFT onto Fairfield Avenue, and drive 1/2 mile to the intersection of Hillside Road on the right. Turn right and drive 6/10th of a mile. The Greenwich High School is on your Right, and the parking lot is behind the School
