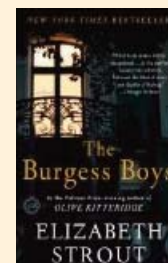

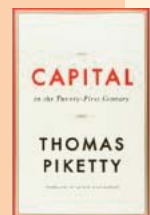

Thomas Piketty has written a new book that has captured the imagination of economists all over the world. Briefly, he describes a process where the rich must get richer, in a capitalist system. Is he right? Join Ken Finn as moderator, and our distinguished economic panel, Rae Rosen, Jay Kane and David Kniffen, as we explore the validity and relevance of Piketty's ideas. The future of the free world may depend on it. Questions to ask the panel:



- Are the rich really getting richer or are there just more rich people?
- What are some of cultural factors that are contributing to inequality?
- Does the inequality being produced really take the purchasing power out of the middle class?
- Could taxing supersized salaries or inheritance cure the situation?
- What are the new forms of technology that could help the growth of wealth?
- What can we do about the concentration, beyond taxing the rich?

Centro Restorante (at the Mill), 328 Pemberwick Road, Greenwich, CT 06831

Merritt Parkway North - King St. Exit. Right off exit, 3rd light turn left onto Glenville Road. At bottom of road, turn right, then take first right onto Pemberwick Rd. The Mill is on the right. Merritt Parkway South - Exit 27S. Right off the exit, take right back over Merritt. Then follow direx for MP North. I-95 North Exit 2. Left at stop sign, left at light, right at next light, left onto Byram Rd. At 3rd stop sign, right onto Post Rd. Take immediate left thru the median onto Pemberwick Rd. Follow that to the Mill which is on the left. I-95 South Exit 2. Go straight through the stop to 2nd right. Take 2nd right onto Byram Rd. Then follow direx for I-95 North.

Curtain Call, 1349 Newfield Ave., Sterling Farms Golf Course, Stamford, CT 06905

Merritt Pkwy: Exit 35, rte 137, (High Ridge Road). From southbound, turn right toward downtown Stamford. Go under Parkway Bridge and turn left at light. (Buxton Farms Road). From northbound, go straight across the intersection onto Buxton Farms Road. At stop sign turn right onto River Road and left onto Intervale Road. At top of

hill turn right onto Newfield Ave. Sterling Farms Golf Course driveway is first left. I-95: Exit 8. From southbound, turn right onto Elm Street. From Northbound, go straight three lights and turn left under the highway onto Elm Street. Follow Elm Street as it becomes Grove Street and Grove, then Strawberry Hill Ave., then Newfield Ave. About 1.4 miles from Newfield Green shopping center, you will pass the light at Weed Hill Ave. The Sterling Farms Golf Course driveway is about 1/2 mile from the light, on the right.

The Family Room, next to the Parish House (located at Christ Church Greenwich)

From I-95, take exit 4 (Indian Field Rd.). Coming from New York (northbound side), turn left off ramp. Coming from New Haven (southbound side), turn right. Follow Indian Field Road to the traffic light at Route 1 (also called Post Rd. or East Putnam Ave.). Turn left and continue for about 1.5 miles (3 traffic lights) until you see large parking lot and Christ Church on your left.
