DIRECTIONS TO COTTON CLUB GREENWICH EVENTS

Rye Playland Amusement Park Rye, NY

Playland Parkway is Exit 19 off I-95 in Rye, NY. At the end of the Parkway, there is a rotunda with a small sign off to the right saying "to beach area and concert," which represents the closest parking. The concert is on the boardwalk of the beach area. The main parking lot may be used but it is a walk. If the weather is questionable, call Playland at 914-813-7010. If the concert is cancelled, we will be there the following Friday, July 20th.

Shakespeare on the Sound, Pinkney Park, 177 Rowayton Ave., Rowayton

From I-95 North: go to exit 12, toward Rowayton. Turn right onto Tokeneke Rd/CT-136. Continue to follow CT-136. 177 Rowayton Ave. is about 1/2 mile on the right just past Jo's Barn Way. Merge onto I-95 S/Governor John Davis Lodge Turnpike toward N.Y. City. From I-95 South, take exit 15 (Route 7), toward Norwalk/Danbury. Fol-

low signs for South Norwalk/Maritime Aquarium (left lane). Turn left onto West Ave. Go straight into Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. O'Niell's Pub & Restaurant is on the corner. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. becomes Wilson Ave/CT-136. Go straight onto CT-136/Wilson Ave. Follow Wilson Ave. until it ends. Turn right onto Rowayton Ave. (just past Bryan Rd.). Destination is on the left.

Zody's 19th Hole, E. Gaynor Brennan Golf Course, Stamford

From I-95 north: Take exit 6/Harvard Ave. At end of ramp, go straight one block. Turn left at next light onto West Ave., go straight across Post Road, then bear left around the island, turning onto Stillwater Ave. Continue on Stillwater about 1/8 mi. On your right you will see the Hubbard Heights golf course. Turn into the parking lot. From I-95 south: turn right off of exit 6 onto West Ave., then follow the directions above.
